

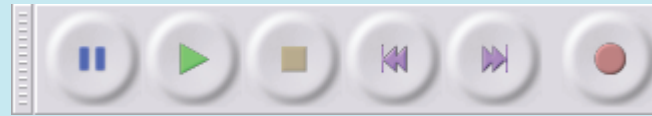
Menu Bar

The *Menu Bar* holds most of the common software options. The *File* menu is probably the one you will use the most, especially the *Export* function.

Playback Control

These are the usual playback buttons (*Pause, Play, Stop, Rewind, Forward, Record*)



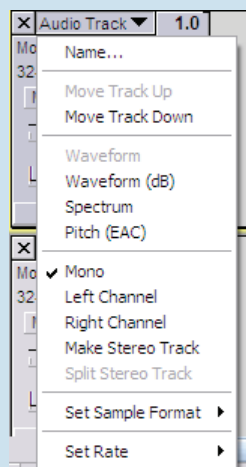
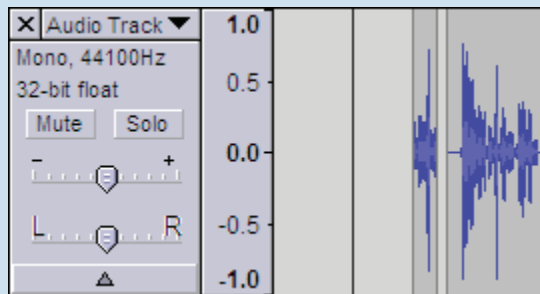
Mode Toolbar

These buttons will let you toggle between different editing modes (*Selection/Position, Envelope, Draw, Zoom, Timeshift, Multi tool*)



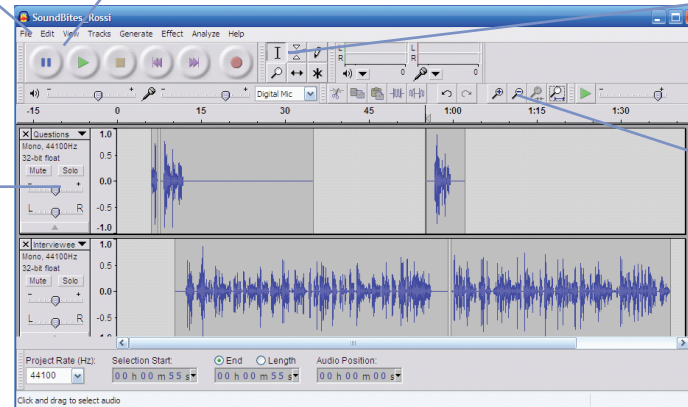
Tracks

Having multiple tracks lets you mix them together.



Multiple options are available for each track. To access the track menu, you must click on the section where you see a triangle pointing down.

Most of the time, you will want to split stereo tracks, get rid on one side and make the remaining side in mono.



Zoom Toolbar

Use these buttons to *Zoom In, Zoom Out, Zoom on the Selected Zone or Fit in Window.*



Envelope and Timeshift Tool

The *Envelope* tool (also referred to as *Rubber Banding*) is the most useful tool to mix your track together. First, you need to click the *Envelope* tool button. You will be able to create cue points on all tracks to adjust the volume level. By using the *Timeshift* tool, you will overlap music tracks and voice to create a professional-sounding audio track.
